





EN OVERALL APPEARANCE OF COOLERS

2. INTRODUCTION

Please read carefully the manual prior to use your cooler in order to have maximum efficiency from the cooler produced to serve you for long years.

"Environment friendly" technologies have been used, and materials and gases not harming natural life have been preferred throughout all processes in the production of cooler.

Please read this manual carefully and thoroughly in order to get maximum efficiency and to avoid any usage mistakes.

Please check if the cooler is defective or not upon delivery. In case of any defects, refer to your authorized dealer within at most 24 hours.

Caution! Wait for at least 2 hours to operate the cooler after any transportation. If the cooler has been subject to a temperature below 0°C for a long time, wait for the compressor temperature to reach above +5 °C before starting the cooler again.

4. INSTALLATION / INITIAL OPERATION OF COOLERS

Air circulation on the back side is necessary to get maximum efficiency from coolers. Push backwards and place the cooler.

At least 10 cm of space should be left on the side and back part of cooler.

Then connect the plug to the socket.


Type label is located in the refrigerant part of the cabinet.

5. USAGE OF COOLERS

For OF 185, OF 375, OF 880, OF 1100 model only;



These coolers have been designed to prevent any contact with air from outside thanks to an air curtain.

The products to be cooled should be place on the base section and shelves. The products placed on the base should not hinder absorbance vent.

Cooler should not be placed near those areas with high air circulation (such as in front of an air conditioner, under air channel and etc).

Food stuff to be cooled should be placed in a manner not to hinder air circulation. Otherwise there might be great temperature differences between lower and upper sections of the cooler.

A heater is placed inside vaporization container on the lower section of cooler. When the water level reaches to contact such heater, a sizzling sound is produced. Such sound is due to the heating of water but not due to a failure.

For E 300, E 400, E 600 model only;

Place the products to be cooled onto shelves.

Avoid blocking the suction vent by the products placed onto shelves.

Don't place the refrigerator close to the points having more air circulation (front of air-conditioner, door, under air channel etc.)


Place the foodstuffs to be placed to the refrigerator in such a way that it cannot prevent air circulation

Otherwise there can be big undesired heat differences between lower part and upper part of the refrigerator.

There are logos on this product. There is no power on/off button on the refrigerator. Light illuminates all the times.

The replacement of florescent tube can be made by opening the panel with logo. It is recommended to replace the fluorescent lamp and starter at the same time.

There is no defrosting timing for this product. Adjustment was previously made and no additional adjustment is needed.



Night Cover: (For OF 185, OF 375, OF 880, OF 1100 model only)

This section is fixed onto the front upper section of cooler. The cover should be drawn to save energy during those times when any product is not be taken from the cooler other than working times. Open the cover by pulling the handle and attaching to the cover holder on the front section of cooler. When you want the cover closed again, spring mechanism will automatically be activated upon removing from the holder and rewind the cover.

Air Curtain (honeycomb & vent sheet):

This is an air current generated on the front section of cooler to prevent cold air within the cooler getting affected by outside air. Air blown from inside the honeycomb behind night cover on the upper section of cooler is absorbed by the absorbance vents on the lower section of cooler to produce a current. Honeycomb and vent sheet should not be hindered to prevent air current from getting affected and low performance of cooler.

Attaching the shelves:

First fit the upmost shelf into the spaces on shelf carrying profiles on the back corners of cooler with upper claws into the space, and then after installing the 2nd claw, press slowly on the shelf to make it properly fit into the space. Then with the same method attach other shelves. The materials inside the cooler are cooled by air circulation so do not place shelves close to each other.

Defrosting:


Cooling process performs automatically defrosting thanks to thermostat control. Water produced after defrosting accumulates in a channel under water evaporator and conducted to drain pan through a pipe and evaporated.

Defrosting might be accelerated by placing a cup of hot water (but not boiled) under the cooler.


Clean the device after defrosting and wipe water and humidity inside. Plug in the device again and refill the cooler after one hour.

Replacing the fluorescent lighting: (If your product has fluorescent lamp)

Before dismantling the lamp, always unplug your visi-cooler. After dismantling the lamp cover inside the visi-cooler, remove the lamp and always replace it with a lamp of the same features (length, power etc.)




Unplug your visi-cooler.




Rotate the lamp 90°.




Remove the destroyed fluorescent lamp.



Place the new fluorescent lamp.



Rotate it 90°.



Switch on your visi-cooler again.

WARNING:

Your cooler can have a fluorescent lamp. If the fluorescent lamp don't illuminate or start to blinking, please call techical service to repair it in a short while. Please do not remain your cooler with non working lighting system.

WARNING:

Your cooler can have a LED illumination. If you face any problem with LED illumination, never try to repair it yourself. Inform an authorized service.



5.a. FOR FIGURE 1 TYPE ELECTRONIC CONTROLLED MODELS

Control unit flashes for a few seconds in order to check if all connections are made correctly when the cooler is plugged in. This is normal, then the display will indicate current temperature. Set temperature is adjusted to keep your beverages at optimum temperature, please do not attempt to change the settings. Control unit set values are protected with a password.

Front panel of control unit is waterproof (IP65). However do not wash the surface where control unit is placed for safety reasons.

5.b. FOR FIGURE 2 TYPE ELECTRONIC CONTROLLED MODELS

Control unit flashes for a few seconds in order to check if all connections are made correctly when the cooler is plugged in. This is normal, then the display will indicate current temperature. Set temperature is adjusted to keep your beverages at optimum temperature, please do not attempt to change the settings. Control unit set values are protected with a password.

Front panel of control unit is waterproof (IP65). However do not wash the surface where control unit is placed for safety reasons.

If this symbol is on, it means that compressor is running.

If this symbol is on, it means that cooler is defrosting.

6. CLEANING, MAINTENANCE AND TRANSPORTATION OF COOLERS

Clean your cooler regularly for best efficiency. Do not use alcohol (spirit) cleaning powder or hard materials for cleaning. Plug off your cooler prior to cleaning. Wipe with a blend including 2 teaspoons of soda water into 1 lt water. Wipe the external part of your cooler with a wet cloth and dry with a dry cloth.

Warning: Do not use hot water, electrical heater, sharp devices and similar objects as your cooler might be damaged.

Vacations/Intermitting Use;

If you are to go on a short vacation or stop using for a while, do not plug off your cooler.

If you are to go on a long vacation or stop using for a long while, plug off and discharge your cooler. Clean and dry with a cloth the interior parts of your cooler after defrosting.

Transportation:

Plug off your cooler during transportation and defrost. Clean inner walls and base with a humid cloth and carry in normal use mode.

Warning: Expansion gas (C-Pentane) is used for cooler insulation and therefore you should act in accordance with the rules and laws of the country where the cooler is used during out-of-use times of body. Cleaning/maintaining of your cooler's condenser must be done at least two times in a year by authorized service

7. STEPS PRIOR TO CALLING AUTHORIZED SERVICE

If cooler is not working;

- -Plug might not have been properly fit into the socket.
- -Plug might be out of power or fuse might have blown.
- -Check to see if power is off and plug is connected to the socket or not.

If cooler does not cool enough;

- Air current might be insufficient inside your cooler because it is over-loaded Cleaning/maintaining of condenser might not done.

If cooler emits odors:

- -food stuff with smell might be in open containers.
- -Interior is not clean enough.

If your cooler does not work as necessary after controlling the above steps and taking necessary actions please consult to nearest authorized service with model and serial number of your cooler.
